Council member D. Davis asked that himself, and commissioner Nolden be able to speak before the presentation by Bryon Boston from Wellness Services. Thanked commissioner Nolden for coming.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Connie Owens – 1097 W. Stanley Rd. – Friends of the Library – Discussed sidewalks being icy, and not shoveled. Asked if she was able to shovel the sidewalk herself, showed pictures of the icicles, and snow covered sidewalks to Council members.

Mark Whalen – 624 Wilson Ave. – Friends of the Library – Passed out photos of the repairs needed at the library. Discussed Mt. Morris library being ranked top in the county, all the groups that use the library, public support, and that the library should be first priority.

Lillian Bigelow – 381 Oak St. – Discussed Ordinance on location of trash bins.

Maureen McGillis – 12348 Parklane – Discussed City Ordinance on parking on lawn. Would like to see something done about the parking of vehicles at rental unit located at the corner of Parklane and Mt. Morris.

Mayor Duane Dunckel suggested complaint forms be completed for these types of issues so they can be addressed.

Officer Nearing discussed the proposed use of NARCAN by the police officers, and that he is against it. Stated the reasons for not wanting the police officers to carry NARCAN being officer safety, cost, and medical first responders, paramedics, ambulances, sheriff department deputy's already having NARCAN and readily available. Recalls only one time in his years on the department where NARCAN could have been used. Discussed the need to replace outdated equipment, and more officers on the road being more effective to the community.

Council member D. Davis asked officer Nearing about cost, and thanked Officer Nearing for his opinion.

Scott Hemeyer from ROWE discussed needed documents status for loan closing. Let Council know that he is still waiting on water permit from the county, will then be sending documents to DEQ, which can take up to 30 days for review, so cutting it close for the proposed March 16th deadline.

Connie Owens – 1097 W. Stanley Rd. – Friends of the Library - Discussed liability, and asked if Council ever thought about having their meetings at the community room.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

a. None.

NEW BUSINESS:

a. Discussion by D. Davis: Opium epidemic Statistics/NARCAN.

Council member D. Davis thanked Bryon Boston, and Commissioner Nolden for coming out today. Discussed research done by himself, and Council member T. Davis on the Opium epidemic. Informed Council that they have both been trained, and have received a NARCAN kit. Disagrees with Police Chief Becker's choice to not have the police officers carry NARCAN. Went over statistics, definitions, pending legislations, and conversations had when doing research on this topic.

b. Discussion by Commissioner Nolden: Opium Statistics/NARCAN.

Commissioner Nolden went over documentation from a power point that he will later email to Council, on the statistics on the county opium epidemic. Discussed pending Genesee County class action law suit against drug manufacturers. Stated that cost can be expensive, and when you call 911 paramedics that respond will have NARCAN. Informed Council of new morgue, and that Dr. Hunter would be willing to come to a meeting.

c. PRESENTATION: Bryon Boston from Wellness Services, on NARCAN.

Bryon Boston, and other members of Wellness Services, gave a presentation on how NARCAN is used, training on administering NARCAN during an overdose, and what services they provide.

Council Minutes February 12, 2018 Page Three.

Council member D. Davis discussed risk for first responders, and residents due to this epidemic, but stated that the people need to stay ahead of this problem, and take some action. Discussed Wayne County being proactive, gave examples of programs they have, and asked why Genesee County isn't doing the same.

Council member T. Davis asked Police Chief Becker how many of the past overdoses that occurred in the city had been repeat offenders.

Chief Becker stated that all six overdoses that occurred in the city were repeat offenders.

Lou Templeton discussed not being against this program, but would like to see more programs in the school to help with drug prevention.

Bryon Boston finished the presentation by letting everyone know to call with any questions, training, or information on their services.

Council member D. Davis discussed Genesee County Sheriff department being willing to come out and talk to the schools, train, and or speak on this topic at no charge.

Lillian Bigelow understands both sides of this debate, but stated we don't need something we already have.

Marc Whalen discussed neighborhood watch group starting back up, suggested everyone come to the meetings. gave everyone meeting schedule time, and stated it would be a great time for everyone to see the community room and the things that need to be fixed.

Council member D. Davis stated that there is a false sense of security thinking that an ambulance will show up in time to save someone from an overdose.

d. Social Media Policy.

Council member D. Davis asked about the white house located just north of Central School, stating he has seen people working on the house.

Fire Chief Vogt discussed code violations being a crime against property, not crime against people so they take longer in the court system. Violators can get up to 45 days to correct problems. Asked if cardiac, allergic reactions, or diabetic related deaths will be addressed as well as the drug overdoses.

Police Chief Becker stated he does not appreciate the statement that was made that he does not care about lives. Stated that he is against his officers carrying NARCAN due to their safety, and that he, the Fire Department, and his officers have put their lives on the line every day to help the residents of this community.

City Clerk Kristina Somers asked why this needs to be something the officers have to carry, why not have it available other places like city hall in the cause that this type of emergency happens. Discussed Genesee County having places to dispose of old, expired meds, and sharps. Wanted to make the information available to residents that come into City Hall.

Mayor Duane Dunckel stated this was a great discussion, and these types of issues need to be discussed. Thanked the Davis's for setting up the presentation, and bringing the topic to our attention.

What Is It?

Hope Not Handcuffs is an initiative started by Families Against Narcotics (FAN), aimed at bringing law enforcement and community organizations together in an effort to find viable treatment options for individuals seeking help to reduce dependency with heroin, prescription drugs, and alcohol, It is a solution.

How It Works

A person struggling with any drug addiction can come to any of the participating police agencies and ask for help. They will be greeted with support, compassion and respect. If accepted into the program*, the individual will be guided through a brief intake process to ensure proper treatment placement.

If a person is uninsured or has Medicaid, we will work directly with the local Office of Substance Abuse Services for placement. If a person has private insurance, we will provide them with treatment options covered by their plan. Regardless, our team will work to get them into treatment as soon as possible. Over 200 volunteer Angels will help with paperwork and provide compassionate support until a treatment option is found.

*Exceptions that may make someone ineligible for the program: A felony or domestic violence warrant; Danger to others; Under 18 without parent or guardian consent; Medical condition that may need hospitalization.
